Arrangement as a translation

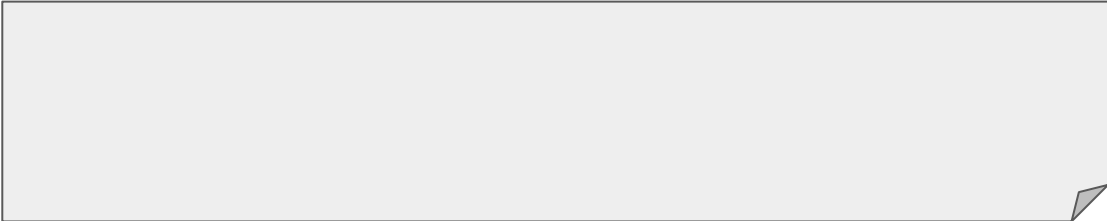

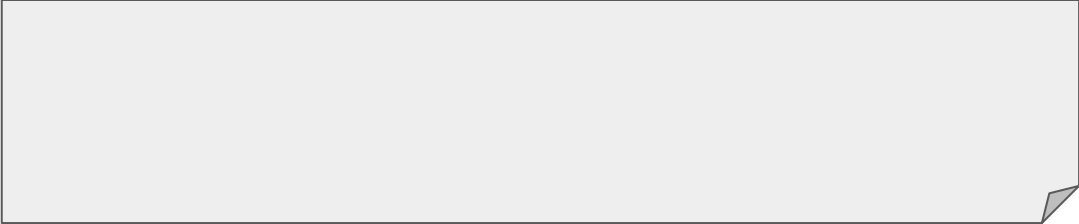


Op. 93. Quintet, First mvt.

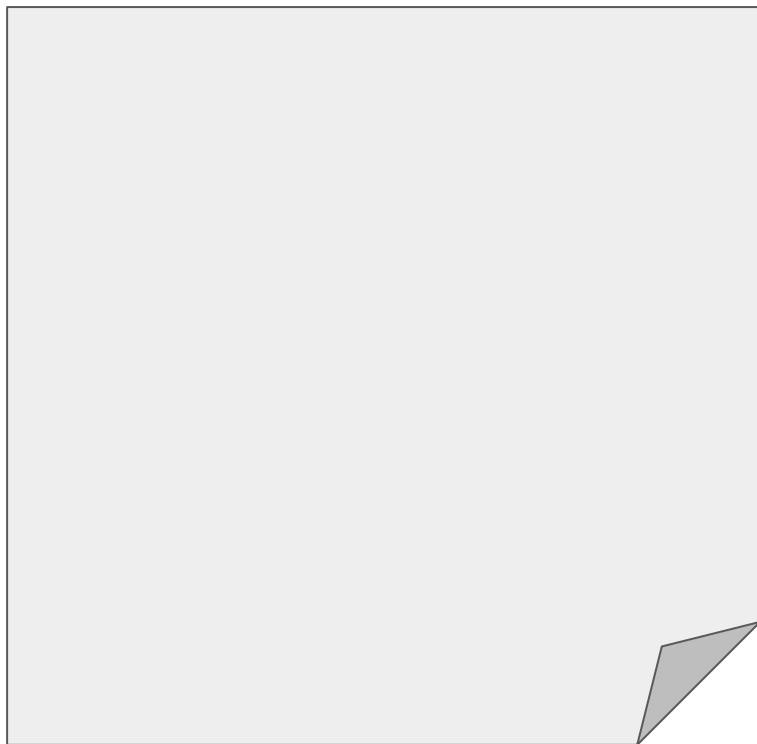


Beethoven, *8th Symphony arr. for Quintet*, Op. 93. (Steiner, 1816).

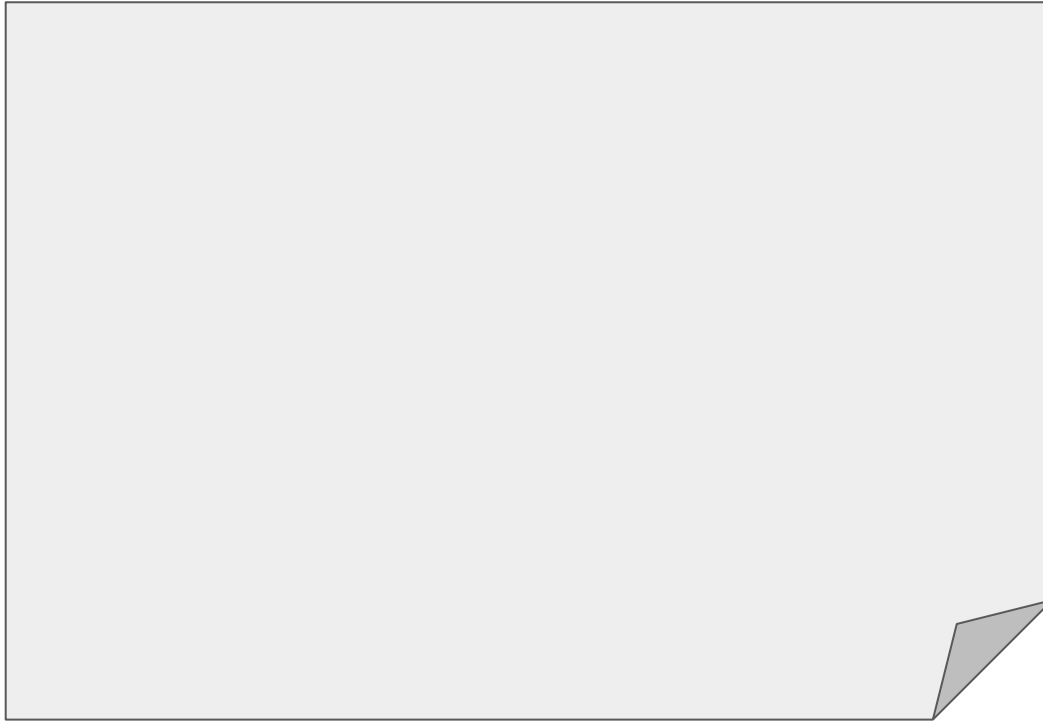


Textural vs pitch fidelity

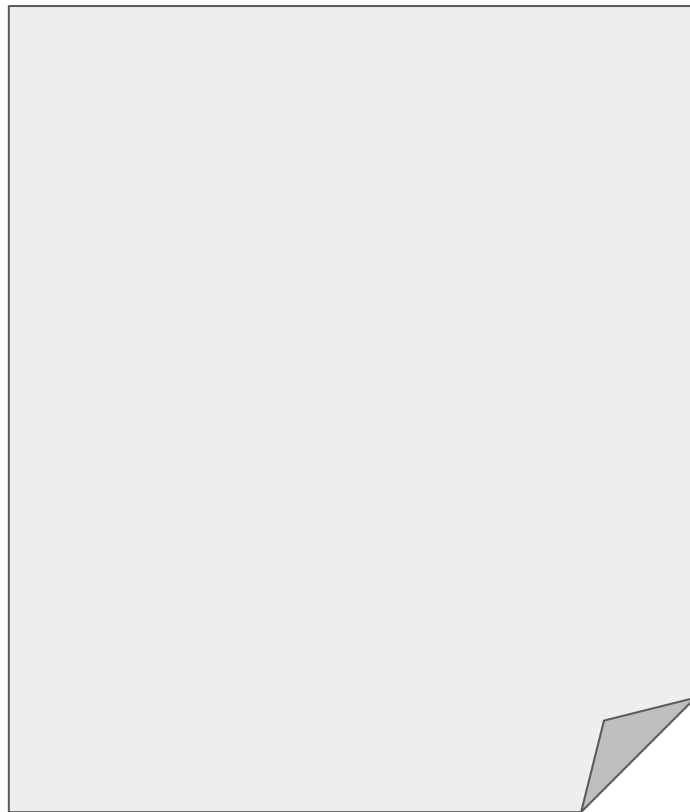

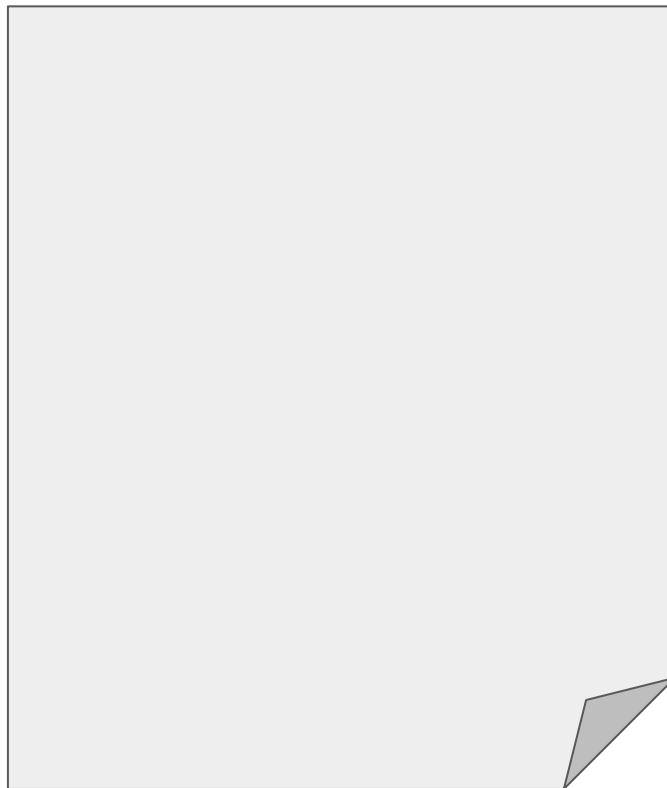

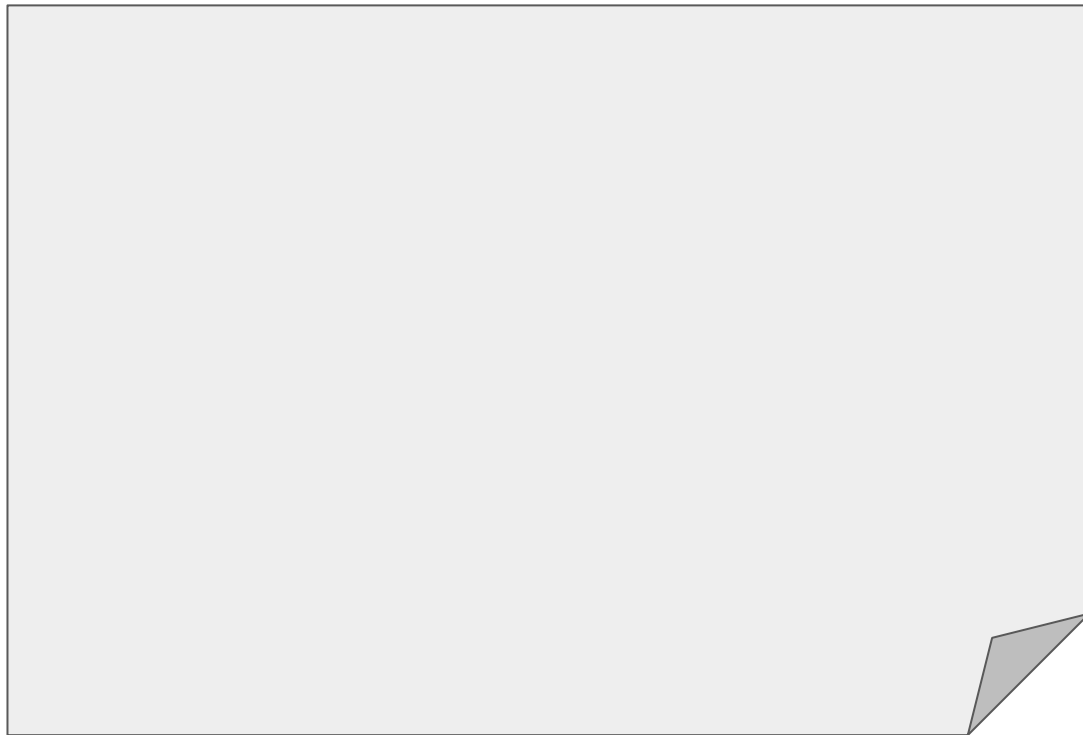
